

Principal's Update: Thursday 22 June

Dear Parents / Guardians

With the recent increase in Coronavirus cases in south-east Melbourne, the school continues to follow the Department of Education school health and safety measures guidelines. Please note the following:

If your child is unwell, please do not send them to school.

If your child has been in close contact with another person undergoing Coronavirus testing, they should remain at home until the testing results have been returned negative.

Parents must continue to 'drop and go' their children to school each morning. We continue to operate an expanded drop off time from 8.45am- 9.15am. Parents should practice physical distancing.

Parents should not enter the school if not necessary; for senior students they can be dropped off at the school gates.

Parents are not to enter any classrooms.

Students require a personal drink bottle.

The school continues to have enhanced cleaning protocols and hygiene practices for students and staff.

In the case parents are not comfortable to send their child to school in current circumstances, you should keep them home.

A few other reminders:

Parent -Teacher interviews will be conducted tomorrow by phone/video-conference.

School finishes at 2.30pm this Friday 26th June.

Term 3 commences on Monday 13th July.

If you have a child to enrol for Prep 2021, please go to the button above and complete the 'Expression of Interest' form.

If you need to pick up your child from school, it is preferred it is before 1.00pm or after 2.00pm; this makes it easier to quickly get your child from class.

When ringing the school for a student absence, please remember to state clearly: your child's name, grade and reason for absence.

Please note the final 2 curriculum days for the year are in term 3. These dates are: Monday 3rd August and Wednesday 9th September. Both days are pupil-free days.

Thank you to all parents and our school community, for their support and care in getting through this very challenging school term. I wish all families a safe and enjoyable school holidays. I am sure we are all keen for things to return back to normal as soon as is safe to do so.
